- To prepare the students for various Inter Collegiate Competitions.
- To arrange regular meetings of Heads of the Departments associations and NSS.

**Following outcome achieved in the academic year 2004-05.**

Most of the programmes chalked out at the beginning of the year could be completed, except a lecture or a programme, which was to be arranged for the teachers on role of teachers and quality improvements of teachers.

- We conducted regular meeting of IQAC with the Heads of the Departments, associations and Alumni throughout the year and planned many activities.
- We had prepared academic calendar in the beginning of the year including dates of examinations, Association and club activities, sports, cultural programmes, NSS activities etc. We implemented the calendar very seriously. We found that some students find Accounts and English little difficult. Hence we introduced a terminal examination for accounts in addition to preliminary examination for the subject and found that students have responded very well.
- We have conducted separate classes for ATKT students, which proves successful.
- Our students from B. A. & B. Com T Y students prepared mini projects in their subjects. The students also participated in various competitions conducted in our college.
- The Department of commerce in association with UGC organized a one day symposia  
On “Globalisation and its Impact on Rural Development” on February 2002.
- To prepare a question bank with the participation of the faculty.
- Various N.S.S. Programmes like Tree Plantation, Blood Donation Camp, and 10 days special camp for development of women, water literacy programme, and water conservation programmes.

- Through Cultural association “Rakshabandhan”, and various cultural activities, contests like, Rangoli, fine arts etc. where eminent personalities were invited as judges. Students were also sent for various Inter Collegiate Competitions.
- The department of English provided consultancy service to students, teachers and public. Though not yet formally inaugurated, the Dept. has been offering linguistic and literature consultancy for last many years.
